

## ICE CLIMBING IN THE TETONS

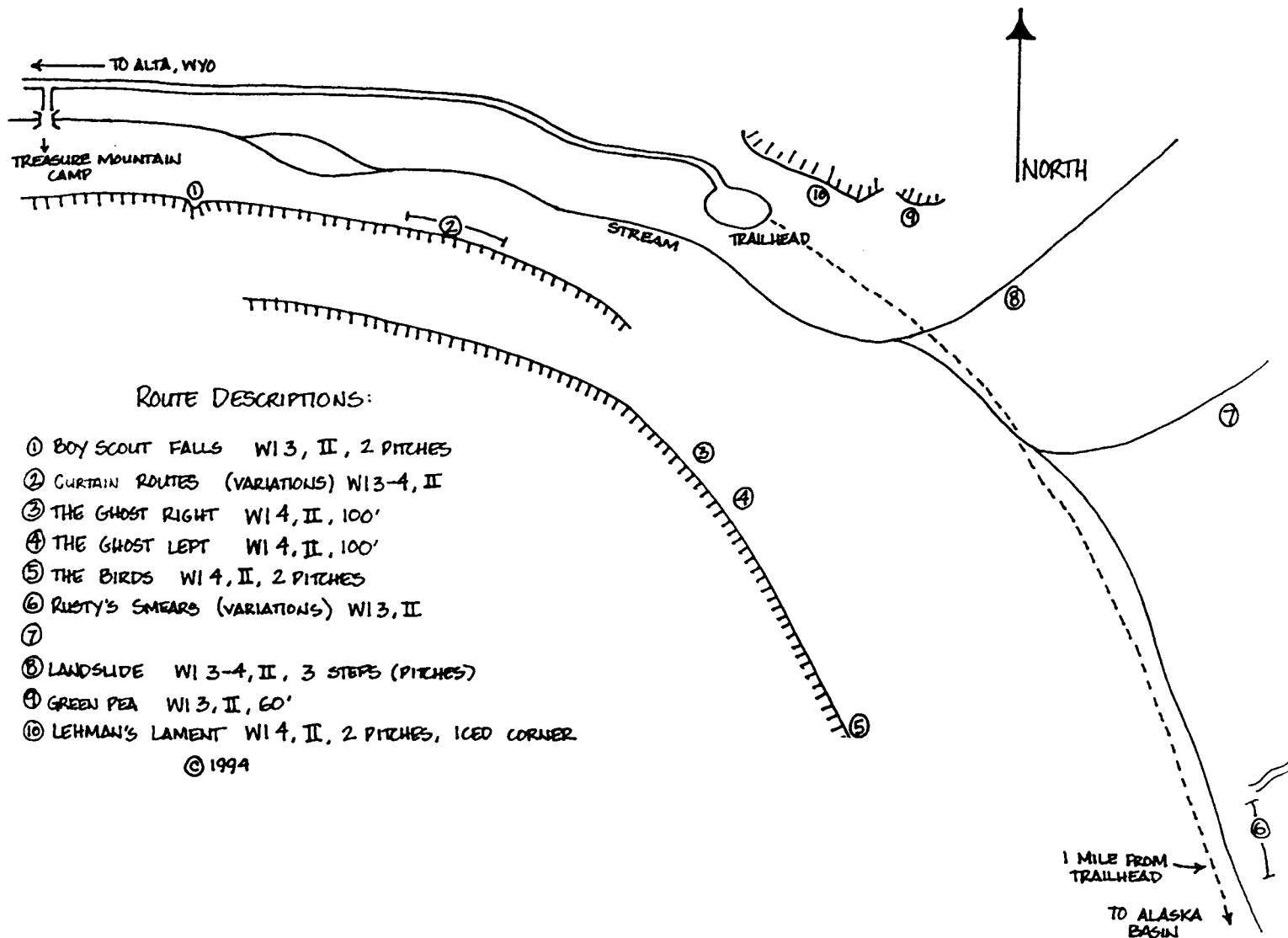
This ancient valley called Jackson's Hole is home to some of the country's best mountaineering and rock climbing routes, and during the winter months it's canyons hold, for the more motivated, excellent ice climbing as well. The Tetons also have the benefit of being centrally located near some of the continent's best ice, with Cody just six hours to the north, and Hyalite only four hours to the north. If you are hankerin' for roadside venues, Provo canyon is just five hours to the south. Even the spectacular formations of the Canadian Rockies are only fourteen hours north, and Telluride and Ouray just twelve hours south.

Teton ice climbs are usually noted for their lengthy approaches and alpine settings. Objective hazards such as avalanches and rock-fall are to be anticipated. For updated information concerning backcountry avalanche and

weather conditions call the 24 hour Bridger-Teton National Forest avalanche and weather report at 307 733 2664. Teton Mountaineering keeps a record of all the Bridger-Teton national Forest reports for the current winter season if you are interested in glimpsing the snow pack history before heading out, to aid in making your own evaluations. Teton Mountaineering offers free access to the valley's best source of weather forecasting , Mountain Weather, so you can get a better idea of current weather conditions heading towards our area.

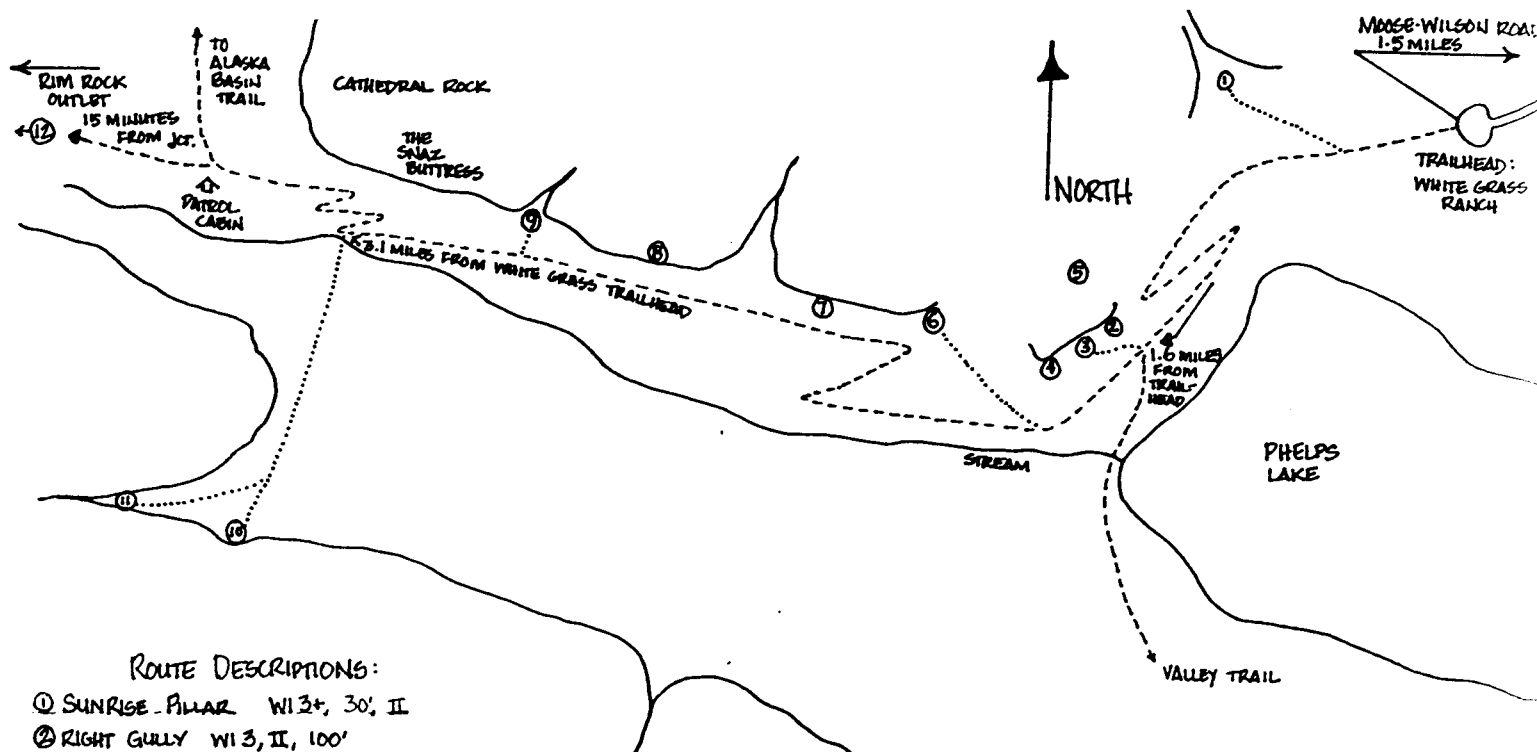
